



Share & Prayer



Please consider a gift of your time, talents, and treasure this fall. You can give to the church; that is how we get things done. "And your gift will return to you." - Luke 6:38








Church Council Meeting Minutes

September 19, 2023 Centenary United Methodist Church, Pentwater MI

Present: Bart Zachrich, Patti Davidson, John Faas, Shannon Larson, Jean Russell, Elaine Konyha, George Van Scoyok, Pastor Vaughn Thurston-Cox, David DeNolf, Beth Russell, Sandy Lyon, Gene Jankowski, Susan MacGregor

Meeting was opened at 6:00 PM with a prayer by the Pastor.

Bart Z introduced the agenda and made an amendment to add a discussion of the functions of the Property Management Committee and discussion of council nominations was moved to after the Approval of the Council Goals.

The minutes from the previous meeting were presented and approved by all present.

John Faas gave a report from the Finance and Operations team. He presented a proposed policy for handling funds raised within the church and from outside the church. The proposal was included in the August 14 minutes of the Finance and Operations team. It was moved by Susan MacGregor and seconded by Beth Russell to approve the police as presented. The motion was approved unanimously.

John Faas led a discussion regarding the role and responsibilities of the Property Management Committee and it was suggested that the sentence "Property Management is responsible for the care and storage of all equipment and furnishings held within the church facilities." be used.

John Faas reported that the Finance and Operations Committee had identified an auditor who had been recommended by the Methodist Church, to conduct an audit. The cost will be \$500. This will be an online audit. Funds had not been set aside in the budget for this so he brought it before Council. George Van Scoyok moved that we approve the audit process and cost and Jean Russell seconded the motion. The motion was approved unanimously.

The Church Council Goals were discussed. A subcommittee met and recommended that the 5 goals identified previously be changed to 3 goals.

Goal #1 was generally accepted with the measurable steps being a) and b). Goal #2 was discussed the the change of c) to 'Develop a definition of discipleship.'

Church Council Meeting Minutes, continued


Discussion of Goal #3 revealed that work needs to be done. George Van Scoyok noticed that the former Goal #4 had been eliminated and should be incorporated into the new Goal #3 in some form. There was some confusion as to whether the Calendar in #3 was an 'Annual Calendar' that reflected recurring annual events, or a calendar specific to that particular year. This will be discussed by subcommittee.

The Clergy Compensation Recommendation Report for 2024 weas presented. A motion was made to approve by Patti Davidson and seconded by Sandy Lyon. The motion was passed unanimously.

Nominations were not discussed due to lack of time.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:15 PM to prepare for an SPRC discussion on Zoom with the District Superintendent.
