

Quiet Corner - Thoughts and Prayers for a Praying Community

Praying the Psalms—Praising God

Former Centenary Pastor Mike Tupper once asked me: "What is your favorite psalm?" I was blind-sided; I was a "new" old Christian and not very familiar with the Psalms. His question planted a seed and I began to read and pray the Psalms. One of my favorite books is Psalms for Praying by Nan Merrill. Pastor Mike encouraged me to memorize a psalm or two and I am still trying to do that. Have you ever memorized a psalm? Do you have a favorite one, two, or three? My favorites are Psalms 1 and 139. For Psalms of Praise, try reading 148, 149, 150.

Henry Nouwen said of the Psalms, after his experience of living and praying for several months in a Trappist monastery in America, that the Psalms "slowly become flesh in me.....slowly these words enter into the center of my heart. They are more than ideas, images, comparison; they become a real presence.....Many times I have thought if I am ever sent to prison, if I am ever subjected to hunger, pain, torture, or humiliation, I hope and pray that they let me keep the Psalms.....How happy are those who no longer need books but carry the Psalms in their heart wherever they are and wherever they go. Maybe I should start learning the Psalms by heart so that nobody can take them away from me."

Thomas Merton has called the Psalms "at once the simplest and the greatest of all religious poems. In the Psalms we drink divine praise at its pure and stainless source, in all its primitive sincerity and perfection. We return to the youthful strength and directness with which the ancient psalmist voiced their adoration of the God of Israel". He cannot write of them except in the context of praise. He sees them as the best possible way of praising God.

Prayer: Marvelous Maker, we, like the psalmist, are in awe of your creation and your way of Divine Love that flows in and through us and all creation. When lost in the wonder or overwhelmed by a sense of smallness, remind us of the great treasure you find in us and the covenantal relationship you share with us. Flood our minds, our hearts, and our souls with deep praise and thanksgiving for your abiding presence, and the privilege of not only coming into our true selves as we abide in you, but the joy in serving you whole-heartedly that others may encounter the wonder of your love and grace. May we who live by the Spirit know joy and harmony in the everlasting Dance of the Cosmos! In Christ, we pray. Amen.



Church Council Meeting Minutes

May 16, 2023

Minutes for Church Council taken by Elaine Konyha Centenary United Methodist Church, Pentwater Michigan

In attendance: Bart Zachrich, Vaughn Thurston-Cox, Elaine Curtis, Elaine Konyha, Gene Jankowski, Patti Davidson, Jean Russell, Beth Russell, John Faas and Shannon Larson.

Church Council Meeting Minutes continued

Pastor Vaughn started the meeting with a prayer at 6:00 PM

The Minutes of the last meeting were presented. A Motion to approve the minutes was moved by Jean Russel and seconded by Beth Russel. Motion was passed.

Values Workshop Follow Up – It was generally agreed that the Values Workshop in April had been a success and the ministries of the church were working on setting goals for the next year. David DeNolf and John Faas have volunteered to meet with any group who would like help in setting goals and objectives. Goal creation should also be talked about in the Program Coordination Committee as the ministries get together. There should be an annual meeting in the fall for setting goals now that the ministries have some training. The role of the Church Council is to promote this process. As part of this process the Council must set its own goals and objectives.

Council Goal Setting – In this initial discussion 4 goals were suggested and discussed. No final conclusions were reached.

Unified leadership within the Council and between the Council and the congregation. There is an on-line class 'Courageous Conversations' that is designed to help local church hold difficult discussions while maintaining the love we hold for each other. https://discipleship-minitries.teachable.com/p/courageous-conversation-2022. The pastor suggested that each member of Council take this class.

After taking the class the Council would practice the concepts and process presented. Increase opportunities for discipleship by encouraging each ministry to discuss how they are meeting the call to be disciples. Establish a process for Ministries to identify and accomplish the goals that they are setting. This would include discussion and evaluation by both the Council and the Ministries. Examine each activity of the church and identify which ministry that activity is part of. This would serve two purposes 1. An intentional church organization and 2. Help to the budget process for Finance and Operations.

Request for approval of Zion Direct for stock Donation- The church currently uses Morgan Stanley to sell stock that has been donated to the church. Zion Investments is an established firm that is designed to do this. Morgan Stanley charges \$50/\$1000 and Zion Investments charges \$10/\$1000. Finance and Operations requested Council approval that they change firms. After discussion Elaine Curtis moved that the change be made with a 2nd by Beth Russell. The motion passed unanimously.

Finance and Operations request for the Kitchen Compliance Coordinator be added to their committee as a voting member. After discussion, Elaine Curtis moved that this position be added to Finance and Operations with a 2nd by Patti Davidson. The motion was passed unanimously. Identification of all CUMC Ministries – for budget and insurance reasons, Finance and Operations

requested that the Council make a list of which activities fall under which ministry. Since this request had been discussed under Council Goal Setting, the request was acknowledged but only briefly discussed at this time.

Pastor Vaughn presented flyers for his summer series of sermons on the Green titled "A Summer in Song with Centenary UMC" and Faith on the Lake.

Pastor Vaughn moved that the meeting be adjourned with a prayer at 7:50 with a 2nd by Bart Zachrich. Meeting was adjourned.

May 10, 2023

Opening Prayer: Mat Hacker Approved minutes of 4/12/2023

- 1.Fire prevention plan. John Faas has had contact with EPS and they will install our new control board on May 17. They will connect compatible equipment immediately and the new additional sensors as soon as they are available. Half of the cost of the complete program has been paid.
- 2.Sign project update. Ruggles has been contacted concerning building the brick structure to house the new electric sign. Half of this project has been paid to date. Pentwater bricks will be donated by the Richey's and some others if necessary. The necessary permits will be gotten as soon as possible. We already have city permission for the brick structure and sign.
- 3. Tuck pointing project: The tuckpointing project will be done by Ruggles. We anticipate an early summer start. Initial estimated cost is \$30.000 on the top side. We expect it will be less unless some unforeseen problems occur. Half of this project has been paid at this time.
- 4. Stain Glass window project is COMPLETE.
- 5. Lower-level window replacement. Will complete painting and outdoor finishing touch-ups this spring as part of our spring workday or before.

- 6 Parsonage front door is in. It will be installed as time and weather permit. Roy and Jim will coordinate.
- 7. Update on progress of "Security Review". Progress to date is slow.
- 8. Review May 19 workday and current projects: Mulch out front, replace ceiling tiles, work on front down spout paint windows in storage area black, paint frames on new windows on south side of church and any additions.
- 9. Update on wall divider in Wesley room. Reviewing options.
- 10, Review list of long-term projects and assigning of individuals to get estimates are as follows: Presently, Roy will cover items1 and 2. John will cover item 3 and 8. The Richey's will cover item 4. Mat will cover item 5. Bart will cover item 6. As we get information it will be added to the existing list.
- 11. Worship Committee has requested the purchase of some audio equipment. It has been purchased and is in the test stage now. If necessary, it may need to be returned or replaced,
- 12. Miscellaneous items Reviewed letters from the State of Michigan concerning boiler room correction needed. Tanner needs to inspect our boilers and report to the state. Reviewed checks received from Church Mutual for our participation with their company's insurance program. Pastor Vaughn discussed the "Faith on the Lake" program on June 24. Reviewed the United Methodist Church Conference structure.
- 13. Reviewed the handouts from the April 29th all church work session. Provided blank project sheets for all committee members to fill out before our next meeting so we can begin the process of formulating our annual goals and objects under the new structure. John and I will consolidate the information.

- 5. Parsonage deck project. \$4,000.00 to \$6,000.00 depending on size
- 6. Rekeying the church to include electronic locks on the NW entry. Estimate \$4000 to \$20000
- 7. Possible air exchange system for the sanctuary. Cost TBD
