



#### **Church Council Meeting Minutes**

June 20, 2023
Centenary United Methodist Church, Pentwater MI

Minutes for Church Council taken by Elaine Konyha

Attending: Bart Zachrich, Elaine Curtis, Pastor Vaughn Thurston-Cox, George Van Scoyoc (via Zoom), John Faas, Gene Jankowski, Jean Russell, Susan MacGregor, Sandy Lyon, Shannon Larson, David DeNolf, Beth Russell, and Elaine Konyha

At 6:00PM Pastor Vaughn opened the meeting with a prayer.

The Minutes from last month were presented. A motion was made by Beth Russell to accept the Minutes with a 2nd by Elaine Curtis. The motion passed unanimously.

John Faas as Treasurer presented the Balance Sheet as of June 30, 2023, and Treasurer's report as of June 30, 2023.

The Finance Committee asked a question of the Church Council. "Should Finance and Operations team oversee the endowments? If so, the charter will need to be amended and signed at the next charge conference meeting. If no, then a committee needs to be assigned to that task." After discussion, a motion was made to give Finance and Operations Committee the authority to make a decision regarding who will oversee our endowment within existing policy. Finance and Operations will then return to the Church Council regarding that decision. The motion was passed unanimously.

The Finance and Operations committee asked the council for guidance on procedures when church members are raising money for groups other than Centenary UMC. After discussion, the Church Council agreed that anyone wishing to raise money for groups outside the church should present the idea to the Program Coordination Committee. The idea would be considered to fit with the vision and mission of the church. Then the ministry that was responsible for the fundraising would present the idea to the Church Council. Finance and Operations would then receive the funds and distribute them. The Church Council recommended that John Faas take this recommendation back to Finance and Operations.

The Finance and Operations Committee recommended to the Church Council that a 4th person be appointed as an official signature on checks written by the church. Current signers are John Faas, Janet Waidelich, and Jim MacGregor. Since these people are not always available, a 4th was requested. The Church Council recommended that a 4th person be appointed.

The amended Goals of the Church Council were presented to the Church Council. There was a

discussion of the 5 Goals. Members of the Church Council will prayerfully consider these goals over the next month for discussion, amendment, and acceptance of the Goals with timelines for implementation.

The question of identifying Ministries was presented. It is a request of the Finance and Operations Committee and a possible goal for Church Council. The definition of a ministry was also being considered. The book Simple Governance by Stefan Ross was brought up and will be referenced for a definition that is acceptable to the Church Council.

Bart Zachrich brought up the topic of Charge Conference responsibilities. A blank Profile of the Church was handed out to the Council. Council members will fill this form out individually and give it to Bart to use to fill out the official version. Bart will email copies of last year's profile for members to reference.

Bart asked Elaine Curtis for pictures that she might have of the Church Council to use in a rack card. Elaine will look to see if she has any appropriate pictures.

A motion was made at 8:55 PM to adjourn the meeting, which was passed unanimously, and Pastor Vaughn closed with a prayer.

#### July 12, 2023

Opening Prayer: Pastor Vaughn Approved minutes of 5/10/2023

Present: Bart Zachrich, John Faas, Jerry Overla, Jim Crum, Dennis Voorheis, Pastor Vaughn, Mat Hacker

- 1. Fire prevention plan. New control board is installed, and current equipment is operational. Remainder of new equipment to be installed in August.
- 2. Sign project update. New electronic sign is here and will be tested in the next few days. Permanent installation is expected in August /September once brick structure is built.
- 3. Tuck pointing project: Expected to begin in August along with the sign project.
- 4. Lower-level window replacement. Completed
- 5. Parsonage front door is in. It will be installed tentatively on August 21. Jim and Roy will evaluate needs to repair broken window in study area of the parsonage.
- 6. Update on progress of "Security Review". Progress has been very slow. Jim Crum will assume leadership role of this project with all current members remaining on the subcommittee.
- 7. Review May 19 workday projects completed. Discussed getting stone for around garbage and recycle containers before winter.
- 8. Update on wall divider in Wesley room. Currently on hold.
- 9. Postponed review list of long-term projects and assigning of individuals to get estimates are as follows: Presently, Roy will cover items 1 and 2. John will cover item 3 and 8. The Richey's will cover item 4. Mat will cover item 5. Bart will cover item 6. As we get information it will be added to the existing list.
- 10. Worship Committee has requested the purchase of some audio equipment. New equipment was received does not work and will be returned for credit. Other options are being considered.
- 11. The State of Michigan boiler room correction is completed. Tanner has completed their inspection and we're waiting on state license to arrive.
- 12. Reviewed the handouts from the April 29th all church work session. Discussed formalizing the roll and responsibilities of the Property Management team to be discussed at our next meeting to be submitted to Council for consideration.
- 13. Discussed getting a more secure waterproof display container for the chalk in front of the church to reduce damage and loss of chalk to weather. Jim will look into this project.

14. Will call rug cleaners to get the parsonage rugs cleaned in accordance with our contract.

- 6. Rekeying the church to include electronic locks on the NW entry. Estimate \$4000 to \$20,000
